DIRECTIONS: 1686 Dry Run Road, Millboro, VA 24460

From Warm Springs, take SR 39 east for approx. 5.3 miles. Turn left onto SR 609 and travel 1.7 miles to the shooting range sign. Make a right at the sign and go 1 mile to the end of the road.

FACILITIES: A great location for recreational, stationary target shooting. Five benches for 50 yard shooting and five for 100 yard shooting. Benches are covered, and each consists of a seat with a level surface for zeroing firearms. Target supports consisting of wire are attached to posts for hanging targets.

Special events and maintenance activities may require temporary closure.

Shooting Range Rules:

No skeet shooting.

No automatic weapons.

Area open sunrise to sunset.

Being in the area after sunset is prohibited.

No alcohol or drugs allowed.

No camping, campfires or stoves allowed.

A voluntary donation tube is beside the information board. Please consider donating to assist in purchasing supplies to maintain the range.

NEARBY ATTRACTIONS: Continue east on SR 39, make a right onto SR 629 to reach Douthat State Park. This area offers campgrounds, picnic areas, a beach, cabin rentals, hiking, and seasonal interpretive programs.

The towns of Warm Springs and Hot Springs are located west off of SR 39, and offer a variety of Bed & Breakfasts, shops, art galleries, restaurants, warm springs, classical music and a selection of seasonal activities.
